As a StriveTogether cradle-to-career partnership, **Northfield Promise** works with other community organizations and leaders to enact changes that will enable students of color and their families, and those experiencing poverty, to have the opportunity to reach their fullest potential. Systems indicators are ways of measuring progress toward racial and ethnic equity. **Here are some measures of progress made in 2021-22:**

Racial & Ethnic Equity

• Teaching Fellows: Five community members were selected in spring 2022 for a 2022–23 Teaching Fellowship through the Northfield Public Schools. The program is supported by a *Grow Your Own* grant from the Minnesota Department of Education. Northfield was one of six districts in the state to receive the grant, which aims to help Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) members of the community attain their teaching licenses. A new round of applications opened in fall 2022.

Northfield Public Schools launched the TalkingPoints translation platform district-wide in fall 2021 for all students in grades pre-K-12, as a way of removing obstacles to family engagement.
 Teachers and staff can send text messages in English and have those messages translated into a family's home language using artificial intelligence and human translators. Parents can respond in their language of choice, and the return messages are translated into English.



• The Northfield Racial and Ethnic Equity Collaborative (NREEC) collaborated with community partners to provide a free customized customer service training in August that focused on diversity, equity and inclusion for 195 employees from 29 Northfield businesses. The training was based on local survey data collected in spring 2022. The NREEC is composed of 20 community institutions and organizations, including Growing Up Healthy and Healthy Community Initiative. It strives to build shared cultural competence, understand biases, and carry out the work of systems change to begin shifting policies, practices, resources, and power structures.



Northfield PROMISE 10 Benchmarks

81% of students from economically challenged families attended highquality preschool programs outside their homes for 21 or more hours in 2021, an increase from 52% in 2020 Among all children, the number was **78%**, up from 62% in 2020.

Navigators Boost Connections

Growing Up Healthy's bilingual early childhood navigators worked with 219 children ages birth to pre-K in 2021–22, more than double the number served in 2020-21. Navigators helped to connect children and their families with preschool,

other early childhood programs, screening, and social services. Navigators met with families at the Northfield Community Education Center and brought the mobile Early Childhood Hubs to community events.



• 64% of all kindergartners met or exceeded the gradelevel benchmark for reading in fall 2022; among Latine students, the rate was 41%, and for students from economically challenged families, it was 47%.

Be at grade level in reading and math by the end of 3rd grade

76% of Northfield fifth BENCHMARK 03 graders reported feeling good about themselves. Exhibit physical, This number was slightly social and emotional lower for female-identifying well-being in students, at 71%.

ELEMENTARY

57% of all third graders met or exceeded the grade-level benchmark for

reading; scores went up 5% between 2021 and 2022 for students from economically challenged families, and up 7% for Latine* students.

*Latine is a gender-neutral adjective for individuals with Latin American heritage.

Teachers Seek LETRS Training

Fifty Northfield Public Schools elementary teachers and staff enrolled in LETRS (Language **Essentials for Teachers of** Reading and Spelling), an intensive training to teach early learners how to read based on brain science.

• 59% of middle school students reported feeling that adults in the community care about them "quite a bit" or "very much," a drop from 68% in 2019, the last time students were surveyed.


 Economically challenged and Latine students improved in their reading

proficiency between 2021 and 2022 (up 10% and 3%, respectively); overall, 72% of all sixthgrade students were proficient. Sixth-grade students also improved in math across all demographic groups; overall, proficiency increased from 54% to 59%

ACES Program Launches at NMS

Northfield was selected in spring 2022 as the first site outside of the Twin Cities to host the innovative after-school program **ACES (Athletes Committed**

to Educating Students). The program will serve up to 50 students in grades 6-8, providing project-based lessons that boost math and social-emotional learning skills through the lens of sports.

Students Explore Health Care Careers

High school students completed an interest survey and met with local employers to discuss career options. Northfield Hospital + Clinics offered a presentation for students interested in health care.

Northfield Hospital + Clinics also partnered with the Northfield Community College Collaborative on a new EMT pathway program that launched in fall 2022. The NCCC collaborated with other community partners in 2021-22 to eliminate barriers to postsecondary education; it added free onsite childcare for students attending evening classes, and it offered free evening meals for students with food insecurities and those who lacked the time or the financial resources to purchase a meal before class.
